Many of our films are introduced by guest experts; check back for speaker information as the presentation date approaches. All movies are followed by a "Talk Back" period for discussing what you've seen.

Unless otherwise noted, movies begin at 7:30 p.m.; admission and refreshments are free, try our famous super-crunchy white popcorn!

Friday, August 5: *Inside Out*. Join us on the church lawn for our annual outdoor feature, Pixar Studios' 2015 award winning animated film. **Note special starting time: 8:00 p.m.**

Friday, September 16 – *The Messenger*. Don't miss this beautifully filmed documentary about the tragic disappearance of songbirds throughout the world.

Friday, November 4 – *Ulee's Gold*. Overlooked 1997 gem about a Florida beekeeper whose peaceful life is shattered by a family crisis.

Friday, December 2 – Double Feature: *How The Grinch Stole Christmas* plus *Amahl and the Night Visitors*. 1966 cartoon of the Dr. Seuss favorite, followed by the classic 1951 TV opera for people who don't like opera. This tale of a poor boy and his mother visited by three strange men from the East will warm your heart.

Friday, January 6 – *Rosenwald*. Stirring documentary about a philanthropist who established special schools for African-American children across segregated America, including Prince George's County!

Friday, February 3 – *Groundhog Day*. St. Mary's College professor and film expert Robin Bates returns with this delightful 1993 comedy about that strangest of American holidays.

Friday, March 3 – *Das Boot*. Gripping German war drama, introduced by renowned U-Boat authority and film enthusiast, Tim Mulligan.

Friday, April 7 – *Walking the Camino: Six Ways to Santiago*. Recent pilgrims Gabe and Joani Horchler introduce this 2014 documentary about walking the famed "Way" to Santiago de Compostela, Spain.

Friday, May 5 – *Kitchen Stories*. Scandinavia expert Paul Thompson introduces this delightfully droll comedy from 2004 about a 1950s Swedish efficiency expert trying to improve the kitchen techniques of reluctant Norwegian bachelors.

Friday, June 2 – *The Armor of Light*. In this documentary from 2015, a fundamentalist pastor from the DC area finds his belief in unlimited gun rights challenged by a real world event -- and an encounter with the mother of a victim.
