**Friday, September 8 – *Disturbing the Peace*.** Part of a series of events at Hope focusing on the tragic conflict between Israel and Palestine, this acclaimed 2016 documentary spotlights fighting men on both sides who have dropped their weapons in pursuit of peace. Introduced by Karin Brown, who grew up in Palestine and maintains deep ties to the region.

**Friday, October 13 – *Martin Luther*.** On October 31, 1517, 500 years ago this month, an obscure monk and university professor in a provincial German town initiated a chain of events that would fundamentally alter the course of history. As direct heirs to the revolution that followed, we proudly present this 2002 British documentary placing Luther’s deeds in their broader historical context.

**Friday, November 3 – *Border Incident*.** If you thought the conflict over immigrants entering from Mexico was a recent phenomenon, think again. Film scholar and University of Maryland professor Jonathan Auerbach introduces this classic of *film noir* from 1949 about human trafficking across the border, directed by Anthony Mann.

**Friday, December 1 – *Hugo*.** Don’t miss this delightful Holiday treat from the great Martin Scorsese. Winner of 5 Academy Awards, this 2011 film follows the adventures of a poor boy forced to live in a Paris railway station. Stars Ben Kingsley and Jude Law.
