After two summers without air conditioning in the sanctuary, Hope leadership researched repair and replacement options. Summer attendance dropped significantly; people were wary of inviting newcomers; Living Water expressed reluctance to worship another summer without AC at Hope and was considering other locations.

Leaders found:

- It would cost ~\$37,568 to replace the sanctuary air conditioning system as it was previously designed; repair was not a viable option (B&B Air Conditioning and Heating Service, as of 2/3/25)
- It will cost ~\$15,300 to install two mini-split AC units in the sanctuary, a premium option to cool the space (and option for additional heat in winter if needed). (RV Electrical Services, as of 3/12/25)
- Council has additional quotes for a more basic sanctuary option, or for a fellowship hall option. But council recommends the premium option for the sanctuary.
- Leaders have heard from the AC installation team that new tariffs may increase the hardware costs.

*Council moves that Hope Lutheran Church pay \$15,300 to RV Electrical Services, for the premium sanctuary AC option, to be installed by summer 2025; leadership also requests authorization to spend up to \$4,700 additional for changing hardware costs.*

## **Announcements**

**Sunday Childcare During Service:** Childcare is available for children during worship. Two cleared background checked students will care for the children and lead activities during worship services.

**Elementary Sunday School: Today** and Sunday, **April 27**, from 9:30-10:15am. After some travel and some sickness, elementary aged Sunday School returns. Kids in first grade and older are invited to join each other and Pastor Julie today and April 27 before morning worship. Talk to pastor Julie for more information.

**Special Congregational Meeting - approve AC repair: Today**, immediately following worship in the sanctuary, Hope's council invites all members to join a Special Congregational Meeting to address just one issue: approving the cost of an AC repair. Even if there is a near-term sale and redevelopment of the property, Hope's leadership believes an AC solution is required for this summer. Council has researched options and will present a proposal that will cost in the range of \$15,300 - more than council can approve on its own.

**Resilience Check In, a Facilitated Conversation: Today**, join the next conversation after worship. With all that is happening in our country, our world, and our own lives, we need a chance to reflect and share together. Roughly every other Sunday, about 20-25 people stay after worship to talk together, and we will continue this practice in the coming weeks. As all things at church this is non-partisan, though it does reflect our Christian values. We hope this is a safe space to identify our concerns, anxieties, and eventually the ways we could respond and support our community. Following conversations will be on May 4 and beyond (skipping Easter and Pastor Julie's sabbatical sending).

**Seeking Volunteers:** Support needed for our Easter service and events. Hope's Holy Week schedule is a following page. It takes many staff and volunteers to share this faith story. If you are able to volunteer, reach out to Pastor Julie (or just bring things to Hope). Here are some of the needs:

Donate treats for the Egg Hunt: We're seeking food and non-food treats to put in eggs for children and hide around the yard. In the past, stickers, fake tattoos, ink stamps, tiny bubbles, and musical shakers have been popular. Bring things to Hope and put in a box in the entryway.

Support Foot-washing: Hope is hosting Maundy Thursday services for the first time in a long time. We'll have all the supplies for foot-washing, but are seeking a few volunteers to help keep things organized and sanitary, Thursday evening, **April 17**.

Help set up (especially for breakfast): Saturday, **April 19**, 2-4pm we'll be decorating and setting up for Easter at Hope. Sunday morning, **April 20** before 9am breakfast we're also seeking people to come early and start the coffee pot.

**Quilting Delivery:** Last week six Quilters of Hope traveled to the Lutheran World Relief warehouse in Baltimore to deliver the 14 quilts they had made in the past year. The Maryland warehouse ships approximately 345,000 quilts per year (a similar number are also shipped from the warehouse in Minnesota). These quilts are mostly made by church groups. The group was overwhelmed by the sheer volume of materials processed and shipped around the world.

**Synod Assembly Voting Member:** On Friday-Saturday, **June 6-7** in College Park at Synod Assembly, our region of Lutherans is electing a new bishop. Hope gets to send 2-3 voting representatives to be a part of this gathering, which will include worship, fellowship with Lutherans from around the region, and a bishop's election. People who have attended in the past have said Synod Assembly is a meaningful gathering to know you are a part of something bigger than just one congregation. If you are a Hope member and interested to be a part of this, contact Pastor Julie.

**Synod Connections Sign-Up:** The Metro D.C. Synod has received requests to connect individuals (lay or rostered) from congregations to each other to support connections rooted in a faith community around topics near and dear to your heart. ## Holy Week

**Maundy Thursday:** On Thursday, **April 17**, 6pm at Hope. We'll gather for a new-ish-to-Hope all-ages service of foot washing and communion, especially engaging for children and young people. We did this for the first time last year and found it both fun and meaningful. The service will be in the sanctuary, with people moving around for different parts of the service, including optional foot-washing and communion. Men all are invited to share a meal downstairs at Hope. And then Humble Walk students will host a campfire with s'mores and more scriptural storytelling. Come for any part of this evening, but especially from 6-6:45 in the sanctuary.

**Good Friday:** On Friday, **April 18**, 7pm at St John in Riverdale. Our neighbors at St John Lutheran Church in Riverdale host this evening service. This may be especially resonant as St John has voted to close and is ripe with thoughts of loss, death, and hope for new life.

**Saturday Preparations:** On Saturday, **April 19**, 2-4pm at Hope. A group gathers for cleaning and decorating at Hope. Just as the disciples prepared Jesus' body and the tomb, we prepare space for Jesus.

**Easter Sunday:** On Sunday, **April 20**, 9:30am breakfast, 10:30am worship, 11:45am egg hunt. We begin with a festive potluck breakfast; bring food to share if you are able. Our 10:30am worship service is especially celebratory, including brass instruments and a baptism this year! Then following worship children are invited to an egg hunt on the outside lawn. This is a great morning to invite friends and neighbors.
