
Passing the Peace

Gospel Luke 20:27-38

²⁷ Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to [Jesus] ²⁸ and asked him a question: "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. ²⁹ Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman and died childless; ³⁰ then the second ³¹ and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. ³² Finally the woman also died. ³³ In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her."

³⁴ Jesus said to them, "Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage, ³⁵ but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. ³⁶ Indeed, they cannot die anymore, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. ³⁷ And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. ³⁸ Now he is God not of the dead but of the living, for to him all of them are alive."

Repeat after the leader:

That's the story of God and God's people. God, thanks for your story.

Dismissal

Children are welcome to stay or are invited downstairs to continue reflecting on this story.



And also with you.


Lift up your hearts.

The Lord's Prayer


Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.

Our Communion Practices


Everyone is welcome to participate in communion. Today Hope offers bread, white grape juice and white wine. Pre-filled juice cups with wafers, and pre-filled juice cups with a gluten-free wafer are also available. Juice and wine will be served with pouring chalices. As you come forward to the altar rail, pick up a communion glass. Tell the server if you prefer wine or grape juice. The server will pour into your communion glass. When finished, place the empty glass in one of the round holes at the altar rail or give it to the usher who will be at the baptismal font. You may choose to receive bread only and/or any of the cup options. Any version of communion carries the full power of communion. If you prefer not to receive elements, you may cross your arms over your chest for a no-contact, verbal blessing. You are invited forward to stand or kneel at the railing; after those who wish to come forward receive, servers will bring communion to those who prefer to stay in your seats.



Collecting for Neighbors in Need: Now through Sunday, November 16. This fall, local churches are collecting items to give to neighbors in need at the PG Plaza Day Center. Hope is assigned to collect shirts (any size, especially L and XL), toothpaste, and dental floss. Look for a box at Hope to collect these donated items. Things will be organized and given to neighbors at the Day Center's Thanksgiving meal.

Fall Mission Appeal: An opportunity for Giving, through November 23. Each Fall at Hope there is a special opportunity to give money; locally, regionally, and beyond. You can give locally to the Congregations United for Compassion and Empowerment (CUCE, the organization that runs the PG Plaza Day Center, supporting local people living on the margins, regionally to Refugee Resettlement supporting people, largely Christian Stability Ministry families that Hope knows, resettling in this area, and/or internationally to the Augusta Victoria Hospital in the Holy Land, supporting Palestinians in need of significant medical care.

movies@hope: On Friday, **November 21** at 7:30pm movies@hope presents *No Other Land*. From the West Bank of the Jordan River comes this harrowing story of destruction and survival. Winner of the 2024 Academy Award for Best Documentary, this film consists entirely of real-life footage as a Palestinian family and their neighbors struggle to cope with the demolition of their homes by Israeli forces.

Training Offering Counters: On Sunday, **November 23** after worship there will be a training for offering counters. One important way people serve at Hope is by counting the weekly Sunday offering. Resilience Check In, a Facilitated Conversation: Join us Sunday, November 23 following worship! With all that is happening in our country, our world, and our own lives, we need a chance to reflect and share together. About every other Sunday, about 15 people stay after worship to talk together. As all things at church this is non-partisan, though it does reflect our Christian values. We hope this is a safe space to identify our concerns, anxieties, and eventually the ways we could respond and support our community.
